Bredehoeft, Ph.D. Dr. Bredehoeft will present testimony as to his expert opinion regarding the effects that granting the water rights applications for SNWA's proposed groundwater development and pipeline project would have on the hydrology of Spring, Cave, Dry Lake, and Delamar Valleys and surrounding valleys. 3. James Everett Deacon, Ph.D. Dr. Deacon will present testimony as to his expert opinion regarding the effects that granting the water rights applications for SNWA's proposed groundwater development and pipeline project would have on the aquatic and terrestrial biota and ecology of Spring, Cave, Dry Lake, and Delamar Valleys and surrounding valleys. 4. Duncan Patten, Ph.D. Dr. Patten will present testimony as to his expert opinion regarding the effects that granting the water rights applications for SNWA's proposed groundwater development and pipeline project would have on the terrestrial ecology of Spring, Cave, Dry Lake, and Delamar Valleys and surrounding valleys, with particular emphasis on the flora of those valleys. 6. Peter Gleick, Ph.D. or Heather Cooley, M.S. Either Dr. Gleick or Ms. Cooley of the Pacific Institute will present testimony as to his or her expert opinion regarding water use efficiency and conservation in SNWA's service area and the need for SNWA's groundwater development and pipeline. 7. Rebecca Mills, Coalition of National Park Service Retirees, former Superintendent of Great Basin National Park. Ms. Mills will present testimony regarding the water resources and water-dependent resource of the Great Basin National Park, and the effects that granting the water rights applications for SNWA's proposed groundwater development and pipeline project would have on Great Basin National Park, and the public interest.

27 would have on their water rights, their business, their property, the groundwater
28 dependent resources in White River and Cave Valleys, and the public interest.

regarding their water rights, historic conditions of springs and other groundwater-
dependent water sources in Spring and Snake Valleys, the dependence of their
business on those groundwater dependent resources, and the harmful effects that
granting the water rights applications for SNWA's proposed groundwater
development and pipeline project would have on their water rights, their business,
their property, the groundwater dependent resources in Spring and Snake Valleys, and
the public interest.

resources in White River and Cave Valley, and the public interest.

23 development and pipeline project would have on their water rights, their ranching
24 business and property, the groundwater dependent resources in those valleys, and the
25 public interest.

28 Muleshoe (Dry Lake) Valley, historic conditions of springs and other groundwater-

that granting the water rights applications for SNWA's proposed groundwater
development and pipeline project would have on their water rights, their ranching
business and property, the groundwater dependent resources in those valleys, and the
public interest.

groundwater dependent resources in Spring Valley, and the public interest.

26 Edwards, a 1990 protestant. Ms. Valencia will present testimony regarding the nature
27 and use of her water rights and property in Spring Valley, historic conditions of
28 springs and other groundwater dependent resources in Spring Valley, and the harmful
effects that granting the water rights applications for SNWA's proposed groundwater
development and pipeline project would have on her water rights, her property, the
groundwater dependent resources in Spring Valley, and the public interest.

- 1 26. A representative of the Nevada Farm Bureau. The Farm Bureau representative will
2 present testimony regarding the harmful effects that granting the water rights
3 applications for SNWA's proposed groundwater development and pipeline project
4 would have on the farming and ranching economy and way of life in the affected area
5 and all of rural Nevada, and the public interest.
6 27. A representative of the Nevada Cattlemen's Association will present testimony
7 regarding how the proposed groundwater development and export project would harm
8 the ranching economy and way of life in eastern Nevada and the broader public
9 interest.


